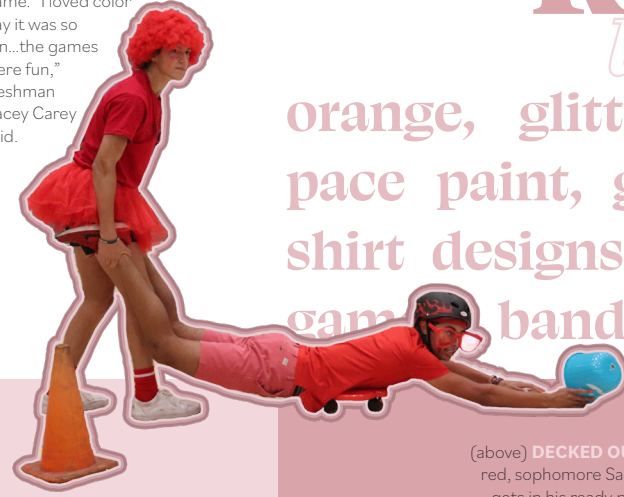

Each t-shirt had a different depiction on both the front and the back, yet most people don't realize the work that went into the designs, or know the people who made them. For the junior shirt, it was a combination of work by juniors Adeline Kwan, Charlie Wang, Renny Argast, and Charlotte Ibbotson-Brown. Through hours of hard work and communication, they were able to create a fantastic Minions' themed class shirt.

As they were creating their class shirt they faced some challenges. One of which was that the minions design was copyrighted. "We made a bunch of designs...and half of them were scrapped," Wang said. "It was kind of discouraging. It was a pretty difficult process, with communicating [with ASB] and redesigning."
